"I have no illusions, I know human beings and I know what they can do. I know they value only gold and silver, and that they are capable of killing their own for a handful of coppers. They are cruel and malicious. They are all that is worst in this world. And yet.. and yet, I have come to care for them. The price of their existence is too high, but what can I do? Can ijust step aside and let them die out? I can't." (Andrzej, 2015: 142)

This quote encapsulates geralt's conflicted feelings towards human society. He acknowledges the flaws and shortcomings of humans, but he also recognizes that they are worth protecting. Despite being an outsider, geralt feels a sense of duty towards humans, and he is willing to fight for them even if they do not fully accept him.

"I don't have to prove anything to anyone, I don't have to be accepted by anyone. I'm not the one who's confused, greedy, and dishonest. I'm not the one who can't tell humans from monsters" (Andrzej, 2015: 90).

Geralt is confronting a group of humans who are harassing him and his companions, the humans are suspicious of geralt and his non human companions, and they accuse them of being monsters. Geralt responds with this quote, asserting his independence and his refusal to be defined or judged by others.

"people, humans are odd creatures. They think and act in ways that defy all logic. They create rules and systems that are supposed to protect them, but in reality, they only serve to oppress and harm those who are different. It's never ending cycle of fear and hatred, and it's one that I'm not sure I can ever truly understand." (Andrzej, 2015: 317) Geralt's more nuanced and complex perpective on the issue of acceptance and identity. He recognizes that humans are capable of both good and evil, and he struggle with the question of whether he should try to fit in with human society or maintain his independence and identity as a monster hunter.

"I'm no different from anyone else. I don't have two hearts, or eyes that can see in the dark. But because of the way I look, people assume that I'm a monster. It's a prejudice that I've had to live with my entire life." (Andrzej, 2015: 91)

Geralt is often judged and discriminated against by humans simply because of his physical appearance. Despite being a skilled fighter and protector of human communities, he is still seen as an outsider and a threat. Geralt's frustration with this prejudice is clear, and it highlights the challenges he faces in trying to be accepted by human society.

"I have always struggled to find my place in this world. As a mutant I am neither human nor monster. I am something in between, and that has made it difficult for me to fit in anywhere. But I have come to accept who I am and to emrace my uniqueness, even if other cannot." (Andrzej, 2015: 52)

Geralt's struggle to be accepted by human society is an ongoing issue for him. As a result of his mutations and profession, he is neither fully human nor fully non human, which makes it challenging for him to find his place in the world. However, he has learned to accept and embrace his differences, even if others cannot or will not.

"I'm a witcher. It's one of the reasons I was treated differently. It's wy they made fun of me, didn't invite me to their parties. They were afraid. I was different. I was dangerous. They didn't understand me. They still don't." (Andrzej, 2015: 31)

Geralt's feelings of isolation and rejextions by human society because of his profession as a witcher. He recognizes that people are afraid of him because he is different and capable of fighting monsters, and he feels frustrated and hurt by their lack of understanding and acceptance

"People are strange. They value their own kind above all else, and yet they destroy and kill their own kind without hesitation or remorse. Monsters, on the other hand, are more straightforward, they don't hide behind hypocrisy and false pretenses. They are what they are, and they don't pretend to be anything else. Perhaps that's why I prefer their company." (Andrzej, 2015: 53)

Geralt's disillusionment with human society and his preference for the company of monsters. He sees humans as hypocritical and prone to violence, while monsters are more honest and straightforward in their actions.

"Always been on the outside, never belonged anywhere. With all sorts, not just humans. Elves, dwarves, even the monsters. He had no idea what to do with a bond. With something that was given to me as a child, something I never had to fight for. For something that was just....there. waiting for me." (Andrzej, 2015: 266)

Geralt's inner conflict as he grapples with the idea of forming a bond with others and being accepted by a community. He has spent most of his life as an outsider, and he struggles to understand what It means to belong and to have something given to him without having to fight for it.

"I am who I am, whether they like it or not. And they don't like it. They think I'm a freak. They think I'm a monster. They don't care about the things I've done to help them. All they see is the monster, and they're afraid." (Andrzej, 2015: 122)

Geralt's frustration with the way that humans perceive him, despite his efforts to help and protect them. He recognizes that their fear and prejudice towards him as a "witcher" and a "monster" make it difficult for him to be accepted and valued as a member of human society. Despite this, he remains committed to his duty and continues to fight for what is right, even if it means facing rejection and isolation.

The Struggle For Being A Good Relationship With Yennefer

Geralt's relationship with Yennefer is one of the monst complex and central aspects of the witcher, and their struggles with each other are explored throughout the novel, geralt and yennefer's relationship is portrayed as tumultuous and difficult, with both characters struggling to understand each other and their own feelings.

"I don't believe in destiny or the higher hand or fate, but I do believe in two people meeting for a reason." (Andrzej, 2015: 200)

This quote highlights the strain and tension in their relationship, as Yennefer struggle with geralt's hesitance and indecisiveness

"You don't understand, yen. I don't want to lose you. I'm afraid I'll lose you. But I'm also afraid of what will happen if we keep going the way we are. It's like we're just going through the motions, and I don't know how to fix it." (Andrzej, 2015: 185)

Geralt's fear of losing Yennefer and his struggle to navigate the complexities of their relationship. He acknowledges that they are both at fault for the problems in their relationship, but he also admits that he does not know how to fix it.

"You know what, Yennefer? You've got the wrong idea about people. You think that everybody's driven by base instincts, and that you're the only one who knows what's important. You're not, and you don't, you don't know a thing about what's really important." (Andrzej, 2015: 52)

This quote demonstrates the fundamental differences between geralt and Yennefer, and their struggle to understand and accept each other's perspectives. Their relationship is strained by external forces, including their duties as witchers and sorceresses, as well as their own personal demons. Geralt's fear of commitment and his own self-doubt often lead to conflicts with Yennefer, who is more assertive and self -assured.

"I'm not sure what to do. I want to be with you, but I'm afraid. I'm afraid of what will happen if we give in to our feelings." (Andrzej, 2015: 83) Geralt's struggle with his own emotions and his fear of being vulnerable in a relationship. Despite this, he and Yennefer continue to navigate their relationship facing numerous challenges and obstacles along the way.

"you're so detached. You're not capable of loving. You're not capable of being loved. Why did you even come here geralt? Why did you seek me out?" geralt responds, "I don't know. I thought... I hoped...that we could start again. But it's not possible, is it?" (Andrzej, 2015: 98)

Geralt and Yennefer have a conversation about their pas and their relationship. Yennefer expresses her frustration with geralt's inability to comit to her and their relationship, while geralt feels that he cannot give her what she wants and needs, their conversation continues with both expressing their conflicting emotions and their desires, showcasing their struggle to navigate their personal relationship.

"I'm not worth it geralt. I can't give you a child, and you want a child. You'll get tired of me sooner or later. You'll find someone else. Someone who can give you what I can't." (Andrzej, 2015: 208)

Their relationship is also tested by yennefer's own struggles, including her infertility and her complicated past, Yennefer confesses to geralt that she fears he will eventually leave her because she cannot give him children.

"sometimes I think I'm still looking for her, sometimes I still look for the girl who smelled of lilac and gooseberries. For the Yennefer from before the lodge of sorceresses, before the magic, when she was just a girl, like any other. And I know I'll never find her, and I tell myself i'm fool for trying." (Andrzej, 2015: 13)

Their relationship is often portrayed as intense and passionate, but also unhealthy and codependent. They both have a tendency to lash out at each other and push each other away, only to comeback together again. Despite their struggles, however, they deeply care for each other and are willing to fight for their relationship.

"sometimes I think, geralt, that it's only we who are unnatural, we hunt and kill, we're capable of cruelty, we're violent and selfish. But we're also capable of denderness, of great loyalty and devotion. We're capable of idealism, of heroism. It's just that we're not capable of living in peace and harmony. That's our tragedy." (Andrzej, 2015: 139)

This quote highlights how geralt and Yennefer are both flawed individuals, but they also have the capacity for love and devotion to each other.

"I want you to know that I've never forgotten. And I'll never forget. That the one thing which bound us, more that blood, more that love, was shame." (Andrzej, 2015: 30)

Geralt and Yennefer have a complex and tumultuous relationship, often struggling with their own demons and the expectations of others. Their love is intense, but also filled with pain and regret.

"he heard the crack of his own bones before he felt the pain. He fell, and the other witcher, in the darkness, trod on his chest. Geralt, choking, sized the man's ankle with his left hand and the sword with his right. The word blade stuck in the stones, and the witcher pressed down, trying to break geralt's neck. Geralt, choking, with tears streaming down his face, tried to twist the sword free. He could feel the man's weight on his chest, feel the bones in his throat grinding. He screamed, inarticulately, and pulled the sword free. It flashed in the darkness, and he swung it blindly, hoping to hit something. The other witcher stepped back, drew his sword and raised it. Geralt lay on his back, gasping for air." (Andrzej, 2015: 129)

Geralt is fighting another witcher in a dark and brutal encounter. Despite being overwhelmed and nearly killed, he manages to fight back and survive the encounter.

"The fight was quick, but brutal. The beast was quick, geralt was quicker. The beast was strong, geralt was stronger. But the beast was vicious, and geralt was unprepared for its ferocity." (Andrzej, 2015: 16)

Geralt is fighting a striga, a powerful creature that is half-woman and halfbeast, and is known for its deadly speed and strength. Despite being able to math the striga in speed and strength, geralt is caught off guard by the creature's ferocity and nearly loses the fight. However, he manages to gain the upper hand and defeat the striga by using his quick reflexes.

I will follow her trail through fire and flood, through desert and storm. I will cross mountains and oceans if I have to. I will face armies and monsters and worse. But I will find her. And when I do, I will be ready to face whoever or whatever stands in my way. I will not fail her again." (Andrzej, 2015: 49-50)

Geralt willingness to face any obstacle or danger to find ciri, no matter the cost. Geralt's love and devotion for ciri is evident in this quote, and he is willing to go to any lengths to ensure her safety and bring her back to him.

"I will find her. I will not rest until she is safe, until she is with me. I will traverse mountains, cross oceans, brave deserts and storms, and fight my way through armies of foes to find her. I will use all of my knowledge and skill as a witcher, and I will call upon every ally and friend I have, to aid me in this quest. I will face any enemy, no matter how powerful, and I will overcome them all. Ciri is my destiny, and I will not let her to be taken from me. I will not let her be lost to me. I will find her, and I will bring her back to me. This I swear." (Andrzej, 2015: 282-283)

Geralt's determination and devotion to ciri is evident in this quote, as he sees her as his destiny and I unwilling to let her to be taken from him or lost to him. He swears to bring and is unwilling to let her to be taken from him or lost to him.geralt fierce protectiveness and love for ciri, as well as his willingness to do whatever it takes to keep her save and reunite with her. "do you know where she went?" geralt asked. "I'm afraid not," the innkeeper said. "but she did mention something about heading to novigrad. Maybe she's there." "novigrad," geralt repeated, considering the information. "thank you, that's a start." "you're welcome," the innkeeper said. "good luck find your princess."
