

AN ANALYSIS OF INTRALINGUAL ERRORS IN RESEARCH PROPOSALS MADE BY ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE STUDENTS (A STUDY WAS CONDUCTED AT UNIVERSITAS NEGERI MANADO)

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ABSTRACT: This research has the purpose of investigating intralingual errors in English Language and Literature students' research proposals that were submitted in research proposals seminars in 2021. This research is in the form of qualitative which designate the result in the form of words. The data comes from English Language and Literature students' research proposals that were presented in research proposal seminars along the year of 2021. In administering this research, error analysis technique was implemented in order to discover the intralingual errors. The result of the study explains that the students made a total of 192 intralingual errors. The intralingual errors that were made by the students are classified into 27 errors in overgeneralization, 20 errors in ignorance of rules restriction, 82 errors in incomplete application of rules and 63 errors in false concept hypothesized. It can be concluded that the intralingual errors occurred because the students did not fully understand the rules of English grammar.

INTRODUCTION

Acquiring a bachelor's degree in literature field in Universitas Negeri Manado requires the students to write research proposals. In writing one, it should be having good content, format and grammar. According to Glatthorn & Joyner in Wekke (2019), writing a good research proposal requires the writer to follow systematic steps which

will then be a well-constructed research proposal. However, writing a research proposal in English is difficult, especially if one's first language is not English. It could lead to errors in the research proposals written by the students of English Language and Literature (ELL) in Universitas Negeri Manado.

Writing using one's second language is harder than using one's first language. Bardovi-Harlig (1995) and Cumming (1989) in Archibald (2004) stated that relative proficiency of one's language competence affects writing difficulty. Based on these statements before, it can be concluded that there are possibilities of having errors in ELL students' research proposals, for example in its grammar as English is their second language.

Grammar is a set of rules that organizes a language (Lengkoan et al., in Soreh et al., 2022). It can be said that grammar is an important element of constructing a well-constructed research proposal as it helps one in constructing sentences correctly. Grammar can also be defined as the rules of a language. However, when the learners contravened the rules of a language, it creates error. Error can be defined as a linguistic deviation of a language. Furthermore, Kaçani (2014) stated that error is a systematic deviation of a language when the learner consistently gets it wrong as there are differences in the grammar structure of the learner's language and the target language.

Intralingual error is a type of error that occurs when a learner tries to transfer source language into target language while not having a complete comprehension about the language rules of the target language resulting a negative transfer in the target language. Richard (1974) in Kurniasih (2013), classified intralingual error into 4 types; overgeneralization, ignorance of rule restriction, incomplete application of the rules and false concept hypothesized. Firstly, overgeneralization is when a deviant structure is created according to the structure of one's first language. Secondly, ignorance of rule restriction is when the learner disobeys the language's structure. The third type of error is the incomplete application of rules, it occurs when the learner fails in applying complete rules of a language. Finally, the last type of error is false concept hypothesized, it is the type of error in which the learner faultily understands the differences between native and target language.

The researcher conducted the research which aimed in discovering and revising the intralingual errors in ELL students' research proposals. In analyzing the intralingual errors the researcher used error analysis technique. Moreover, the benefit of this conducted research is to make the students understand how to write a proper research proposal without any intralingual errors.

THEORETICAL FRAMEWORK

Error

Error can be defined as defying the certain language's systematical linguistics rules. It is produced by those who do not fully understand the system of a language. Error can also be defined as failing to use the correct grammatical system of a language due to lack of competence.

Intralingual Error

Intralingual error is a type of error that occurs when one convert source language to target language with incomplete understanding of target language. Intralingual error is divided into 4 categories according to Richard (1974) in Kurniasih (2013).

1. Overgeneralization

Overgeneralization is a deviation of a language structure which is caused by the structure of one's first language.

2. Ignorance of rules restriction

Ignorance of rules restriction is a type of error by disobeying the the structure of the target language.

3. Incomplete application of rules

Incomplete application of rules occurred when one failed to apply the complete rules of a language's structure.

4. False concept hypothesized

False concept hypothesized is a type of error where faulty comprehension of a language occurs.

Error Analysis

Error analysis is the process of identifying the learner's error in a foreign language (Haryanto, 2007). Furthermore, Ubol (1988) in Muqbel (2018) defined error analysis as an explanation of target language errors of the learners' spoken and written production. Furthermore, James (1998) in Muqbel (2018) defined error analysis as the process of discovering the incidence, nature, origin and outcome of unsuccessful language.

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

Qualitative method was carried out in this research. Bogdan & Biklen in Gerungan et al., (2021) stated that qualitative research is a procedure in which the research is constructed in the form of words. This research is done by using error analysis method. Error analysis is defined by Ellis & Barkhuizen in Ginanjar (2015) as a set of procedures for determining, describing, and explicating the errors. In conclusion, this research is an analysis of determining, describing and explicating the errors in the form of words as its final result. Furthermore, the researcher used error analysis method in carrying out the intralingual errors in ELL students' research proposals. In this research, the researcher himself is the main instrument, followed by researcher's laptop, notebook, papers and pen as the secondary instruments.

The population the researcher used in this research were the research proposals that were submitted along the year 2021 in research proposal seminar in English Language and Literature Department of Universitas Negeri Manado. Furthermore, the researcher used total population as the sample of this research. The reason that it was the most compatible technique to be used in this research is that the population of this research is relatively small and it enabled the researcher to maintain the reliability of the data.

In analyzing the data the researcher used error analysis method by Corder in Wu & Garza (2014) and Sari (2019). The steps are:

- a. Collection of the samples of errors (Sari, 2019)
- b. Identification of errors (Sari, 2019)

- c. Classification of errors (Wu & Garza, 2014)
- d. Explanation of errors (Sari, 2019)
- e. Evaluation of errors (Sari, 2019)

FINDINGS AND DISCUSSIONS

After collecting and analyzing the data, it was found that there were a lot of intralingual errors that occurred in those research proposals. Those errors are classified based on Richard's theory of intralingual error in Kurniasih (2013), which are divided into four categories; overgeneralization, ignorance of rule restriction, incomplete application of rules, false concept hypothesized.

The result showed that errors occurred in all four types of intralingual errors with a total occurrences of 192 times. From all 192 occurrences of errors, 42.70% of total errors belong to incomplete application of rules, followed by false concept hypothesized with 32.81% of total errors, then overgeneralization with 14.06% of total errors and the last is ignorance of rules restriction with 10.41% of total errors.

The errors are written in bold while the corrections are in italic, however there are sentences that have more than one error in it, considering the case then the researcher proceeds to elaborate multiple instance of errors in one sentence separately, for example taking only a phrase of the full sentence so that the error can be seen more clearly.

1. Overgeneralization

Overgeneralization occurs when the writer tried to combine two completely different structure of English. As mentioned before that the researcher found overgeneralization in 14.06% of the total 192 errors in the research.

From the table above, it can be seen that two or more rules were applied in the sentences above. One of the error shows that the student combined the rules of using third person marker in plural noun.

2. Ignorance of rules restriction

Ignorance of rules restriction is a type of error where the learner disobeys the rules of a language's sentence structure. This type of error occurs as the specific rules are being ignored and applying a new rule in the target language.

One of the errors that is shown above is that the student ignored the rules of using the right plural form following the quantifier of the noun.

There **is** two **brother**.

From the sentence above, it can be seen that the noun and its auxiliary should be in plural form following the plural quantifier. However the student ignored the quantifier and put singular auxiliary and noun in the sentence. The correct sentence should be:

There *are* two *brothers*

3. Incomplete application of rules

Incomplete application of rules is a type of error as a result of English learner could not apply the complete formula of English grammar into sentences. From all the data analyzed by the researcher, incomplete application of rules occurred 80 times. This error occurred when a learner failed to fulfil the requirement of having complete rules applied into the sentence.

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The table above shows that the students did not completely apply the required rules in sentences. For example, in the sentence below, the student failed to apply the rule of using possessive marker.

In this research, the researcher uses **Carl Gustav Jung** theory as the research foundation.

The correct sentence should be done by adding a possessive marker after the noun to indicate possession.

In this research, the researcher used *Carl Gustav Jung's* theory as the research foundation.

4. False concept hypothesized

False concept hypothesized is a type of intralingual error that comes from an imperfect grammar perception of foreign languages. Richard in Kurniasih (2013) stated that imperfect perception of grammar rules could be the cause of false understanding as the students try to apply the concept in their writing.

From the table above, it can be seen that the students hypothesized a concept that defied the correct rules of English grammar. For example the student failed to

determine which word class of a word should be used in the sentence, the error is shown below.

If it's too difficult they may **complaint**.

The student used the word in its noun form, however, in order to form the correct sentence, the word complain should be in its verb form which is complain. The correct form of the sentence should be.

If it's too difficult they may *complain*.

CONCLUSION

Based on the findings, it can be concluded that all types of intralingual error occurred in ELL students' research proposals. Moreover, from all types of intralingual error, incomplete application is the most dominant error that occurred in ELL students' research proposals. This study highlighted the errors occurred in the proposals and revised to the better versions of the sentences or phrases. From the amount of total errors it can be concluded that the students did not really understand about the rules of English grammar. The students should focus themselves in learning the rules of English grammar. Moreover, as it is a part of learning, the lecturers should also give more works in supervising the students in learning English grammar.

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
