As per Murphy, the creator telling about Ronnie's trademark through quirk (1972:173). The reader of the novel can know Ronnie's attributes through her habits.

Even thoughthey fight like cats and dogs, she still brings him to the park every weekend.And when he was having trouble in math, she tutored him every night." (Sparks, 2009:23)

Jonah and Ronnie frequently battle. They don not generally get along. Kim, their mom says that Ronnie and Jonah squabble furiously. In any case, Ronnie is as yet a decent sister for Jonah. Here and there, she carries Jonah to the recreation center each end of the week. At the point when Jonah inconvenience in math. additionally helps him. She mentors her sibling. From Kim's words over, the creator of the novel infers that Ronnie is mindful to Jonah. As per Murphy, the creator of the novel uses a person to depict the other person in the story (1972:164). Sparkles utilizes Kim to portray Ronnie's qualities. She cares very much about her sibling.

At the point when her folks chose to get separate, she felt that her folks just consideration about themselves. After the separation of her folks she never feels the affection again, she can't feel it again. The separation of her folks truly influences her and it changes her character.

After the divorce of her parents, she does not believe in love, she does not believe that something good will happen. It is shown from the sentence 'she'd been kind of cynical about the whole thing'. Her parental separation truly makes her extremely upset, it appears to be that nobody has at any point cherished her particularly her folks. Accordingly, Ronnie attempts to satisfy her requirements for affection and belongingness by befriending some unacceptable groups. She frequently invests her energy with her companions at the club, yet she couldn't care less about it, she simply needs to have a place with another person. Going through the late spring with her dad cause her to understand that her dad is a decent man. She figures out how to cherish and to be adored. She realizes that her dad cherishes her and her sibling to such an extent. "I will always love you, and I will always love Jonah." (Sparks,2009: 414) The statement before is taken from the letter that Steve (Ronnie's dad) composed for Ronnie after the separation. understands that her dad won't ever quit cherishing her and her sibling. From the clarification above, it tends to be reasoned that affection and belongingness needs of the fundamental person are satisfied. Despite the fact that toward the starting her relationship with her folks, particularly her dad isn't acceptable, she understands that her folks love constantly her.

Recover quickly from difficulties and

Ronnie likewise has a companion in North Carolina. Her name is Galadriel. however her epithet is Blaze. Blast likewise comes from a wrecked home. She leaves her home since she doesn't care for her mother's new sweetheart. She is an itinerant. She simply lives in a vehicle with her beau, Marcus. Marcus is definitely not a hero and he doesn't care for Blaze. Blast knows it, yet she can't do anything. She just has Marcus after she leaves her home. Blast places that thing in Ronnie's handbag purposely. In view of that Ronnie is captured and taken to the police headquarters. Ronnie realizes that Blaze does it to her, yet she doesn't retribution to Blaze. Once Ronnie meets Blaze once more, she has isolated from Marcus. Blaze's mother shows her out from her home. Her mom will wed with her beau, they get huge battle since she doesn't care for her mother's sweetheart. Her mom changes the locks of the house.

"I know what you want me to do," Blaze said. "But I can't. And it's not because I don't like you. I do. I think you'renice, and I shouldn't have done

what I did. But I'm as trapped as you are. And I don't think Marcus is done with you, either."

Ronnie stiffened. "What do you mean?"

After that second, Blaze comes to Ronnie's house and apologizes to her. She admits that she had placed a CD in Ronnie's handbag in the shop. She signs an affirmation that said Ronnie had no clue about what was happening. Ronnie asks what will end up bursting after she conceded her activity. "What's going to happen to you? Are they going to charge you?" (Sparks, 2009:427). From Ronnie's respond shows that Ronnie thinks often about Blaze. Burst says that Ronnie is a decent individual.

"But you're a great person, Ronnie. You're honest, and you were nice to me when you had no reason to be." A tear leaked out of one eye, and she swiped at it quickly. "I'll never forget the day you offered to let me stay with you, even after all the terrible things I had done to you. I felt such...shame. And yet I was grateful, you know? That someone still cared" (Sparks, 2009:429).

Despite the fact that she has done something awful to Ronnie, Ronnie does not despise her. Flashes enlightens the regarding Ronnie's attributes through discourse. From that discussion among Ronnie and Blaze, Blaze tells that Ronnie is a decent individual straightforwardly.

Have a Strong Determination

To have great enthusiastic development in safeguarding himself and his life esteems, Ronnie Miller advances his determined regardless, particularly after his folks' separation. Mental fortitude is the state or nature of psyche or soul that empowers an individual to confront trouble, threat, agony or changes with restraint unafraid. We can likewise characterize boldness as the psychological or good strength of adventure, endure, and with stand, risk, dread, or trouble. Fortitude is something we as a whole respect. "I believe I will try out at Juilliard," she said gradually. "We'll check whether they'll in any case have me." (Spark, 2009:452). Through her brave, Ronnie will try out at Julliard. This is another approach to realize herself. She has opened her tried out with the melody that she has made with her dad. Since the tryout, she has been playing three or four hours every day. The chief has orchestrated to let her utilization the school's training room. She starts to dabble for certain juvenile arrangements.

Ronnie likewise deals with the inner issue in the wake of realizing that her dad has stomach malignant growth. She feels so baffled, yet she can beat it.

to invest more energy with her dad. She truly thinks often about her dad in the wake of knowing reality with regards to his condition. Then again, her mom needs Ronnie to return to New York with him. Ronnie reveals to her mom that Steve is her dad paying little heed to the way that he engaged in extramarital relations yet Kim's liable face deceives her mysterious. She is disturbed that her mom has been misleading her in regards to the undertaking, an untruth that was important for the explanation she would not converse with her dad for a very long time. Since she requests to remain with her dad and invest more energy with her dad.

That's not my fault. He's the one who left.(Sparks, 2009: 10)

Don't be rude. Your father's talking to you. Say something.

Ronnie crossed her arms. All right. How about this? I'm not going to play the piano for you. Ronnie! Steve could hear Kim's exasperation.

What? She tossed her head. I thought I'd get that out of my way early. (Sparks, 2009: 20)

I hate being here! Don't you get that? And I hate you, too!(Sparks, 2009: 68)

It was clearly that Ronnie has a sense of angry toward her father because he decided to divorced with her mother and left them behind. And because of that she did not want to see or talk to her father and it did affect the change of behavior and emotional of Ronnie after the divorce of her parents. And this was

one of the effects of broken home that happened to Ronnie, the change of behaviour and emotional. It was not only she did not want to see or talk to her father, but she also hated and stopped everything that related to her father, included playing piano.

Ronnie hated the piano and swore she had never play again, a decision even some of her oldest friends thought was strange, since it had been a major part of her life for as long as she had known them. her dad, once a teacher at Julliard, had been her teacher as well, and for a long time, she has been consumed by the desire not only to play, but to compose original music with her father. (Sparks, 2009: 12)

"He taught me to play from the time I was able to walk. I played for hours, seven days a week, for years. We even did some composing together. It is what we share, you know? It was something for just the two of us, and when he moved out of the apartment... I felt like he hadn't only betrayed the family. I felt like he'd betrayed me personally, and I was just so angry about all of it that I swore I'd never play or write another song again." (Sparks, 2009: 256)

It was obviously that Ronnie started to hate and stop playing piano since her parents decide to divorce and her father left the house. She felt betrayed by her father. She started to know and play piano because of her father who teaches her. When finally she started to enjoyed and loved playing piano and desire not only to play but to compose original music with her father, her father leave her. Of course, she would be angry and hated the piano and swore that she would never play it again. She also hated hearing her father playing piano especially when she spent the summer in her father's house. She gets angry to her father every time her father playing the piano in front of her. This is also one of the emotional effect of broken home that happened to Ronnie after her parents divorced.

"I don't like this little game you're playing. He seemed confused. What game? This! Playing the piano every minute I'm here! I don't care how much you want me to play! I'm never going to play the piano again! Especially not for you!(Sparks, 2009: 74)

Besides, the effects of broken home that happened to Ronnie also can be seen from the way she dressed and look in her everyday life that very different from the way she usually dressed and look before her parents divorced.

"How's she really doing? I don't know. | She sighed. And I don't think she does, either. She's in this dark, moody phase. She ignores her curfew, and half the time I can't get more than a "Whatever" when I try to talk to her. I try to write it off as a typical teenage stuff, because I remember what it was like...but...She shook her head. You saw the way she dressed, right? And her hair and that god-awful mascara? Mmm. And? -Itcould worse.(Sparks, 2009: 23)

The change of behavior that happened to Ronnie kept getting worse as can be seen from the quotation: "Yes, but you havent't taken his calls. And every time he came to New York to see you and Jonah, you ignored him and hung out with your friends." (Sparks, 2009: 11)

Ronnie snapped her gum again. From the corner of her eye, she saw her mother wince.

"I just don't want to see or talk to him, Ronnie said. Just try to make the best of it, okay? Your father is a good man and he loves you. Is that why he walked out on us?" (Sparks, 2009: 11)

The change of behavior that happened to Ronnie was not only make her angry toward her father, but also toward her mother. The relationship between Ronnie and her mother kind of bad because her mother always had negative thinking about everything she did.

"I just don't see why I can't spend the summer with my friends, Ronnie whined. Don't you mean you'd rather spend all night at the clubs? I'm not naïve, Ronnie. I know what goes on in those kinds of places. I don't do anything wrong, Mom. What about your grades? And your curfew? And can we talk about something else? Ronnie cut in. (Spark, 2009:167)

From the conversation Ronnie had with her mother, it clearly can be seen that her mother always had a negative things for everything she did. It seems that her mother did not trust her and cannot understand her at all. And it was not stopped untilhere. Her mother even eavesdrop her conversation with her friends and check every messages she had in her phone.

"Mom tries to listen in on Ronnie when she's talking on the phone. And she sneaks Ronnie's phone when she's in the shower and checks her text messages. (Sparks, 2009: 189)

So, it was not only she had the problem with her father after her parents divorced, but also with her mother because her mother seem did not trust and believe her in everything she did. Furthermore, the effects of broken home were not just stopped here. There are still many effects that happened to Ronnie after the divorce of her parents. And yeah, friends and society also take part to the effect that happened to her. Like the problem of shoplifting that she did with her friends in the past.

4.4.2 Conquer the Challenge

Even though after that she admitted that what she had done was wrong and promise that she would never do that again, but, still, she did that because she angry and upset toward her parents for what happened to their family. And it was not a new thing anymore

as what Saheed (1988) stating that children from broken homes end up with a condition that is called Attachment Disorder. As the phrase suggests, it is the lack of attachment that brings about a package of ill behaviors. A neglected and abused child of a broken home ends up with it, since no one cares for him or her. The child may even with a reasonable allowance still indulge in stealing, drugs and other delinquent acts. He maintains that young-offender laws cannot undo the feeling of insecurity and low self-esteem that these children grow up with.

Fortunately, the effects of broken family that happened to Ronnie was still within reasonable limits where it can still be tolerated. But, actually, in this novel there was also another broken home case that can be found, and the effects that happened to that family after the home was broken very different compared to Ronnie's family, especially the effects that happened to the child of that family after the home was broken.

"But Galadriel... she used to be the nicest girl. I've known her since I was a little kid, and I don't know what's been going on with her lately. I know her mom and dad got divorced, and I heard she took it really hard. I don't know what she sees in Marcus, though, or why she's so intent on ruining her life. I used to feel bad for her." (Sparks, 2009: 254)

The differences in effects of broken home that happened between Ronnie's family and Galadriel's family may be occur due to the family itself, how the parents treat their children before and after they divorced with their partner. In Ronnie's situation, even after her parents'divorced and her father left the house, she still lived with her mother and gets anything she need and want and can do whatever she want. And basically, she was a nice girl who knows what was wrong and right. So, the effects that happened to her not really that bad and serious. While in

Galadriel's case, her situation was very different from Ronnie and not in a good way.

"My dad lives with his girlfriend. This is his third one since the divorce, by the way, and she's the worst by far. And you live with your mom? Yeah. But now she has a boyfriend, and he's at the house all the time. And he's a loser, too. (Sparks, 2009: 41)

Well, from here we can see that both of Galadriel parents were seem not really too interest in her life and both of them were busy with their own life and let her lived by herself without any care for her at all. It also can be seen when her mother will only left her money without care what she would do with that money.

"In the kitchen, there was some money on the table, along with a note addressed to Galadriel. When Ronnie caught Galadriel sliding a few bills into her pocket and reading the note, Galadriel mentioned that her mother always left money for her. It was how she know Galadriel was okay when she didn't come home." (Sparks, 2009: 103)

However, it was not the worst case that happened to Galadriel after her parents 'divorced. It kept getting worse as time passes by and the climax was when her mother finally decides to marry her boyfriend.

CONCLUSION

Based on the findings, the researcher concludes that there are threemain characters of self-defense reflected from Ronnie Miller as a daughter in her family and major character in this novel. Those are Have a sense of Concern over hatred, recover quickly from difficulties and toughness and have a strong determination. Self-defencse is an act of defend ourselves from obstacles, challenges and problems and take those parts as an self-improvement, related with the

novel it is against the negative impact waftre her parents divorced. One of the common problems which is facing by Ronnie Miller is the pyschological effect as a child or a daughter in a broken home family.

Furthermore, self-defense is often done by Ronnie Miller from experiencing some mistakes in her struggle, she can face the several aspect of her life especialy in maintaining her relationship with her father, brother, friend and boyfriend. Finally, the researcher concludes that Ronnnie MillerThe Last Song as a broken home child could be faced by self-defense and inner powerto survive from her condition eventough sometimes she faced many problems which is impact from her family condition.
