2. Tauhid Asma' wa Sifat

This type of Tauhid is a belief in the oneness of Allah in His names and attributes as mentioned in the Qur'an and Hadith. There are several things that must be considered in the oneness of names and attributes, namely:

- a. Accept all the names and attributes of Allah
- b. Do not liken the names and attributes of Allah to the names and attributes of His creatures.

- d. Worship Him according to the demands of His names and attributes.

3. Tauhid Uluhiyah
